Rite of Cross and Nails

This year we will use a new visual on Good Friday to highlight the depth of God's love for

us. The Lenten cross in the front of church has holes drilled in it. We have a number of nails with red ribbons tied to them. We invite you to come forward to participate in the Rite of Cross and Nails.

You are invited to come forward and place a nail in the cross. The rite reminds us that Jesus was pierced on Good Friday, not just for the sins of the world, but for each individuals sins. The phrase "pierced for

you" drives this message home.

The red ribbon reminds us that Jesus shed his precious

blood to be the sacrifice that removes the guilt of our sins.

On Easter Sunday the nails will still be in the cross but now the ribbons will be white. This

reinforces the biblical truth that though our sins were like scarlet they are now as white as snow (Isaiah 1:18) because we are forgiven in Christ!

Join us on Good Friday, April 18 at 7:00 p.m. for this new visual proclamation of the good news!
